In 1910 the preliminary work had been carried out by a group of women led by Mrs. E. J. Burton. This group of dedicated women were later known as the Women's Hospital Mission. The intent of this group was to open to the public a hospital in the town of Port Hope.

Land at the southwest corner of Hope and Ward Streets was purchased for the sum of \$5,000. This included a brick two story house located on the property. In January 1913 this building was modified as a temporary Hospital, until a new building was constructed. When the new hospital was opened, in 1916 the old building was converted to a residence and training school for nurses.

The new Hospital was constructed for just under \$24,000. The official opening date was June 29, 1916. In 1922 a west wing addition was constructed.

This hospital serviced Port Hope and area until 1964 when a new hospital was built on Wellington Street. Due to Government cut backs in 1999 this hospital was closed. Patients are now treated in Cobourg.

#### Did you know?

- 1802 Smith's Creek (Port Hope) was the second most populous township in Upper Canada.
- 1834 The Bluestone was built at 21 Dorset Street East.
- 1851 The Port Hope Town Hall was built at 56 Queen Street.
- 1873 A company was formed for the Port Hope Union Cemetery, which was owned by the Town and administered by a Cemetery Board.
- 1946 The Ganaraska Conservation Authority was incorporated.
