Plane Crashes: Town Park

August 11 (year unknown):

Captain Eastwood and Lieutenant Alan Sullivan of the Leaside, Toronto Camp of the R,A,F. visited town in their machine No. C215 and made a landing on the Trinity College School grounds. About two oclock they left, intending to go to Cobourg but in rising the engine failed to operate and they

struck a tree at the town park and the machine crashed to the ground. Lieut. Sullivan received a rather severe scalp wound and was removed to the Port Hope Hospital. Captain Eastwood escaped injury. The machine was a total wreck.

Captain Eastwood, the son of Dr. Eastwood of Peterborough, left here with the 39th battalion. Transferring to the Flying Corps. Upon reaching England he was wounded and invalided home several months later.

It was expected that Lieut. Sullivan would be able to leave the Hospital the next day. He became a well known Toronto poet and novelist.

Did you know?

In 1889 Prime Minister Macdonald unveiled a statue of Col. A.T.H. Williams in front of town hall.

In 1912 the former Opera house at 85 Walton St. was purchased by the Royal Bank.

In 1914 during WW1 (1914-1918) 82 soldiers of Hope Twshp. lost their lives. In 1921 cement bridges were introduced.

In 1929 Port Hope suffered three floods. The first on Jan 19 which was the worst and the others in March and June.



Garden Hill Tagged Monarch Found in Mexico!

During the 8th Annual Monarch Butterfly Tag & Release at Dorothy's House Museum, held on August 26, 2017, a total of 277 monarchs were released. On March 5, 2018, the Monarch Watch program purchased tag XGN 703 from a resident in the El Capulin ejido in the State of Mexico, Mexico. This particular monarch, a male, travelled a direct distance of 3,416 km, but may have travelled twice that distance to reach Mexico.
